# Use active voice.

#### Use correct punctuation

"The student was confident, yet nervous; excited, yet apprehensive, as he presented his research findings."

Correct punctuation is vital in academic writing as it clarifies the intended message.

# The last word in a sentence should be the key to open the next sentence.

Sentence 1: The results of the study were inconclusive. Sentence 2: Nevertheless, they provided important insights into the research question.

The last word in the first sentence is "inconclusive," which sets up the contrast in the second sentence with the word "nevertheless." The second sentence builds on the information from the first sentence by acknowledging the limitations of the study while emphasizing its value in providing insights.
